American Pharmacists Association Bylaws as amended through May 13, 2019.

ARTICLE I. NAME AND SEAL

- Section 1. Name. This ASSOCIATION shall be called the
- 2 "AMERICAN PHARMACISTS ASSOCIATION."
- Section 2. Seal. This ASSOCIATION shall have an official seal.

ARTICLE II. PURPOSE

- 4 Section 1. Purpose. This ASSOCIATION provides information,
- 5 education, and advocacy to help all pharmacists improve
- 6 medication use and advance patient care.
- 7 Section 2. Membership Benefits and Services. In furtherance of
- 8 its lawful purposes and within its corporate powers, this
- 9 ASSOCIATION shall conduct such programs and activities and
- 10 shall provide such other membership benefits and services as
- 11 may be established from time to time by its members or Board
- 12 of Trustees.
- 13 Section 3. Code of Ethics. This ASSOCIATION shall provide and
- 14 maintain a Code of Ethics for pharmacists.

ARTICLE III. MEMBERSHIP

- 15 Section 1. Classes of Membership. This ASSOCIATION shall have
- 16 Member, Student Pharmacist Member, Pharmacy Technician
- 17 Member, and Honorary Member classes of membership and
- 18 such other classes of membership as may be established from
- 19 time to time by the Board of Trustees.
- 20 Section 2. Member. Any pharmacist who is licensed in the
- 21 United States or a graduate of an Accreditation Council for
- 22 Pharmacy Education (ACPE) accredited school/college of 23 pharmacy, any member of a pharmacy faculty, or any other
- pharmacy, any member of a pharmacy faculty, or any otherindividual who shares the ASSOCIATION's mission and vision.
- 25 Members of the former Life membership class shall be Members
- 26 without payment of dues. A Member shall have full voting rights
- 27 and may hold office in this ASSOCIATION as allowed by the
- 28 individual office and in any of its membership organization
- 29 groups in which membership is held as allowed by the individual
- 30 office.
- 31 Section 3. Student Pharmacist Member. Any student enrolled in
- 32 a school or college of pharmacy holding membership in the
 - 3 American Association of Colleges of Pharmacy or accredited by
- 34 ACPE, or a student enrolled in a pre-pharmacy program, shall be
- 35 eligible for membership as a Student Pharmacist Member. A
- 36 Student Pharmacist Member shall also be a member of the
- 37 ASSOCIATION's student pharmacist membership organization
- 38 group. A Student Pharmacist Member shall have full voting rights
- 39 in the student pharmacist membership organization group and
- 40 may hold office only in the ASSOCIATION's student pharmacist
- 41 membership organization group, provided, however, that a
- 42 Student Pharmacist Member shall have full voting rights as a
- 43 member of an ASSOCIATION committee or as a delegate in the
- 44 ASSOCIATION House of Delegates. Student Pharmacist Members
- 45 representing the student pharmacist membership organization

- 46 group in the APhA House of Delegates shall have the right to vote
- 47 in that year's annual election for at-large APhA Board of Trustees
- 48 members and APhA President-Elect, as well as any additional
- 49 issues that may be placed on the ballot from time to time.
- 50 Section 4. Pharmacy Technician Member. Any individual who is
- 52 Pharmacy Technician Member. A Pharmacy Technician Member
- i3 shall have full voting rights in a selected Association membership

a pharmacy technician shall be eligible for membership as a

- organization group and may hold office only in that selected
- 55 membership organization group, provided, however, that a
- Pharmacy Technician Member shall have full voting rights as a
- 57 member of an ASSOCIATION committee or as a delegate in the
- 58 ASSOCIATION House of Delegates.
- 59 Section 5. Honorary Membership. Any individual may be granted
- 60 Honorary membership by the Board of Trustees. An Honorary
- 61 Member shall have no voting rights and may not hold office in
- 62 this ASSOCIATION or any of its membership organization groups
- 63 unless entitled to do so under another class of membership.
- 64 Section 6. Admission to Membership. Any individual shall be
- 65 admitted to membership in the appropriate class of membership
- 66 upon completion of administrative processing of any required
- application accompanied by required dues, provided, however,
- 68 that the Board of Trustees may deny any individual membership
- 69 for cause, meaning conduct tending to damage the public 70 reputation of this ASSOCIATION.
- 71 Section 7. Membership Benefits and Services. Membership
- 72 benefits and services for each class of membership shall be those
- 3 established from time to time by the Board of Trustees. The
- 74 Board of Trustees may add, delete, or adjust membership
- 75 benefits and services as it deems necessary or desirable in
- 76 furtherance of ASSOCIATION purposes. No addition, deletion, or
- 77 adjustment of membership benefits or services shall require any
- 78 adjustment of dues for the membership period during which the 79 addition, deletion, or adjustment of membership benefits or
- 79 addition, deletion, or adjustment of membership benefits or 80 services occurs.
 - services occurs.
- 81 Section 8. Termination of Membership. Any member may
- 82 voluntarily terminate membership by notice to this
- 83 ASSOCIATION. Termination of membership shall be effective
- 84 upon completion of administrative processing of such notice. No
 85 such voluntary termination of membership shall be effective to
 - such voluntary termination of membership shall be effective to
 avoid any debt to this ASSOCIATION. This ASSOCIATION may
- 87 terminate the membership of any member for failure to pay
- 88 required dues. Such termination of membership shall be
- 89 effective at the convenience of this ASSOCIATION. Termination
- 90 of membership shall terminate the right of any member to all
- 91 membership benefits and services.
- 92 Section 9. Dues. Each member shall pay such dues as may be
- 93 required from time to time by the Board of Trustees for each class
- of membership. The Board of Trustees may establish from time
- 95 to time such administrative policies and procedures as it deems
- 96 necessary or desirable to facilitate the payment and receipt of
- 97 required dues. The Board of Trustees may also establish from 98 time to time special dues within established classes of
- 9 membership.

ARTICLE IV. OFFICERS

- Section 1. Officers. The officers of the ASSOCIATION shall be the 100 President, the President-elect, the Immediate Past President, the
- Treasurer, and the Executive Vice President. 102
- 103 Section 2. President, President-elect and Immediate Past
- 104 President. The President shall be a pharmacist from the
- ASSOCIATION's Member category and the principal elected 105
- 106 officer of the ASSOCIATION and shall serve as a Trustee of this
- 107 ASSOCIATION.
- The President shall first be elected as President-elect, and the 108
- 109 year thereafter shall serve as President with the third year of
- service as Immediate Past President. The President shall preside 110
- at meetings of this ASSOCIATION and shall appoint, with the 111
- approval of the Board of Trustees, all ASSOCIATION committees 112
- other than the ASSOCIATION House of Delegates Committees. 113
- 114 The President shall perform such other duties as may be 115 assigned from time to time by the Board of Trustees, but shall
- have no individual duties or responsibility for administrative 116
- decisions or actions with regard to the continuing management 117
- of ASSOCIATION affairs. 118
- No individual shall serve as President-elect immediately 119
- 120 following a term as President or Immediate Past President. A
- vacancy in the office of President shall be filled by the President-121
- 122 elect. A vacancy in the office of President-elect or Immediate Past
- 123 President may be filled by a pharmacist from the ASSOCIATION's
- 124 Member category appointed by the Board of Trustees, except
- that any appointment of a President-elect will be effective only 125
- until the next regular election at which time the membership 126
- 127 shall elect both a President-elect and a President.
- 128 Section 3. Executive Vice President. The Executive Vice President
- 129 shall be a pharmacist from the ASSOCIATION's Member category
- appointed by the Board of Trustees and employed by the 130
- ASSOCIATION as chief executive officer on such terms and 131
- conditions as are approved by the Board of Trustees. The 132
- 133 Executive Vice President shall be responsible to the Board of
- 134 Trustees in the exercise of assigned duties and authorities for 135
- executive and administrative decisions or actions with regard to the continuing management of the ASSOCIATION's affairs. The 136
- Executive Vice President shall serve as Secretary of the 137
- 138 ASSOCIATION and as Secretary of the House of Delegates. A
- vacancy in the office of Executive Vice President shall be filled 139
- 140 by a pharmacist from the ASSOCIATION's Member category
- 141 appointed by the Board of Trustees.
- 142 Section 4. Treasurer. The Treasurer shall be a Member appointed
- 143 by the Board of Trustees and shall serve for a term of three (3)
- 144 years from the effective date of the appointment. No individual
- 145 shall serve more than two (2) consecutive full three-year terms
- as Treasurer. A vacancy in the office of Treasurer shall be filled 146
- 147 for the unexpired term by a Member appointed by the Board of
- 148 Trustees.
- Section 5. Removal. An Officer of the ASSOCIATION (except for 149
- 150 the Executive Vice President) may be removed from office for
- 151 any reason by a two-thirds (2/3) vote in favor of removal by the
- 152 whole Board of Trustees, excluding the vote of the affected
- 153 Officer. Trustees may only vote in person at an assembled
- 154 meeting, face-to-face. No proxies, mail, telephone or other
- 155 indirect means of voting shall be permitted. The vote shall be
- taken by secret written ballot. Counsel to the ASSOCIATION shall 156
- 157 tally the ballots and shall announce only the result.

ARTICLE V. BOARD OF TRUSTEES

- Section 1. Composition. Six (6) Elected Trustees, the Officers, the 158
 - Speaker of the House of Delegates, and the Presidents of the
- membership organization groups of this ASSOCIATION shall 160
- 161 constitute the Board of Trustees.
- 162 Section 2. Duties and Authority. The Board of Trustees shall be
- responsible for the general supervision and management of 163
- 164 ASSOCIATION affairs, including, but not limited to, the specific
- 165 duties and authority stated in these Bylaws. It shall have, in addition to the specific duties and authority stated in these 166
- 167 Bylaws, such duties and authority which from time to time are
- 168 imposed on or recognized by law as being applicable to nonprofit
- 169 corporations. It shall adopt Bylaws and rules or procedures for
- 170 the conduct of its business.
- It shall act with regard to matters of ASSOCIATION policy for the 171
- 172 House of Delegates in the interim between House of Delegates
- 173 meetings and shall make an annual report to the membership
- 174 regarding the programs and activities of this ASSOCIATION.
- 175 Section 3. Election of Trustees. Elected Trustees shall be elected
- 176 as provided for in the Article on elections in these Bylaws.
- Section 4. Term of Office. Elected Trustees shall be elected for a 177
- term of three (3) years and shall serve until their successors have 178
- 179 been duly elected and installed. No individual shall serve more
- 180 than two (2) successive full terms as an Elected Trustee.
- 181 However, nothing in this Article shall prevent a Trustee who has
- 182 served two full successive terms from being elected as President-
- 183 elect or President.
- Section 5. Vacancies. A vacancy among Elected Trustees shall be 184
- 185 filled by a pharmacist from the ASSOCIATION's Member category
- 186 selected by the Board of Trustees to serve the remainder of the
- 187 unexpired term. A vacancy among Officer Trustees shall be filled
- 188 as provided for in the Article on Officers in these Bylaws. A vacancy in the Office of Speaker or the Office of Speaker-elect of
- 189 190 the House of Delegates shall be filled as provided for in the Article
- 191 on the House of Delegates in these Bylaws.
- 192 Section 6. Meetings. The Board of Trustees shall meet at the call
- of the President or on the call of a quorum of the Board of
- Trustees. The time and place of Board of Trustees meetings shall
- be established by the President. 195
- 196 Section 7. Quorum. A majority of Trustees plus one shall
- 197 constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
- Section 8. Removal. A Trustee of the ASSOCIATION may be 198
- 199 removed from office for any reason by a two-thirds (2/3) vote in 200 favor of removal by the whole Board of Trustees, excluding the
- 201 vote of the affected Trustee. Trustees may only vote in person at
- 202 an assembled meeting, face-to-face. No proxies, mail, telephone
- 203 or other indirect means of voting shall be permitted. The vote
- 204 shall be taken by secret written ballot. Counsel to the 205 ASSOCIATION shall tally the ballots and shall announce only the
- 206 result.

ARTICLE VI. HOUSE OF DELEGATES

- 207 Section 1. Composition. The House of Delegates shall consist of
- 208 delegates from Affiliated State Organizations (See Article VII),
- 209 ASSOCIATION membership organization groups, Recognized
- National Organizations (See Article VII), Delegates Ex Officio, and 210
- Speaker-appointed delegates. Each delegate and Delegate Ex 211
- Officio must be a member of this ASSOCIATION.

213 Section 2. Apportionment of Delegates.

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A. Affiliated State Organizations: each shall have two (2) 214 215 delegates plus one (I) delegate for each two hundred (200) Members of this ASSOCIATION, or major fraction thereof, who 216 are members of this ASSOCIATION residing in the state. 217 218 Delegates and alternate delegates from each state should reflect 219 the demographic diversity represented by the ASSOCIATION 220 membership residing in that state.

> i. If either an affiliated state organization delegation has been inactivated via procedures outlined in Article VII, Section 2.G of these Bylaws or no delegates have been appointed by the affiliated state organization by June 1st, the Speaker may appoint one delegate who, at the time of appointment, resides or is employed in the state or region they are chosen to represent.

B. ASSOCIATION membership organization groups: each shall 228 229 have twenty-eight (28) delegates.

230 C. Recognized National Organizations: each shall have two (2) 231 delegates, delegates who are members of the recognized 232 organization.

233 D. Delegates Ex Officio: shall be each Trustee, ASSOCIATION 234 Former Presidents, and Former Speakers of the House of 235

E. The Speaker shall appoint up to 20 delegates from House 236 237 committee members not appointed as delegates from other 238

F. Each appointing organization shall have the right to appoint 239 240 one (I) alternate delegate for up to five (5) delegates that it appoints, plus one (I) alternate delegate for each additional 241 242 five (5) delegates, or major fraction there-of, that it appoints.

243 G. Delegations that have one or more seats unfilled during both 244 House sessions for 3 consecutive years shall have those seats 245 inactivated from their delegate allocation. Delegations shall be 246 notified 60 days prior to the inactivation of delegate seats and 247 may petition the Secretary of the House for reappointment of 248 those seats.

Section 3. Duties and Authority. The House of Delegates shall 249 250 serve as a legislative body in the development of ASSOCIATION policy. It shall act on such policy recommendations as shall come 251 252 before it and shall adopt rules or procedures for the conduct 253 of its business.

Section 4. Appointment of Delegates. Affiliated State 254 Organizations, Recognized National Organizations, and 255 256 ASSOCIATION membership organization groups will appoint the delegates and alternate delegates to which they are entitled 257 258 according to Article VII, Section 2 of these Bylaws and the APhA 259 House Rules of Procedure. All delegates and alternate delegates 260 other than Delegates Ex Officio shall serve until May 31st of each 261 year. Delegates Ex Officio shall serve for life or, in the case of

262 Trustees serving as Delegates Ex Officio, until their successors

263 have been duly appointed or elected and installed.

264 Section 5. Officers. The Officers of the House of Delegates shall be a Speaker, a Speaker-elect, and a Secretary. The Speaker shall 265 266 appoint delegates and Committees as provided in these Bylaws, shall preside at meetings of the House of Delegates, and shall be 267 268 responsible for a report of the actions of the House of Delegates 269 to the members of this ASSOCIATION. The Speaker-elect shall 270 assist the Speaker in the performance of the Speaker's duties 271 and/or perform such duties as specified by the House of 272 Delegates. In the event of a vacancy in the Office of Speaker, or 273 in the event the Speaker is unable to perform the duties of the office during a meeting of the House of Delegates, the Speaker-274

elect shall assume the duties of the Speaker. In the event of a 276 vacancy in both the Office of Speaker and the Office of Speaker-277 elect, or in the event both the Speaker and the Speaker-elect are unable to perform the duties of the offices during a meeting of the House of Delegates, the House of Delegates shall elect a 279 280 Speaker pro tem, at which time a Speaker and a Speaker-elect 281 shall be elected. The Secretary of the House of Delegates shall be 282 responsible for the administrative functions of the House of 283 Delegates.

Section 6. Elections. The Speaker-elect shall be elected during

the Annual Meeting of the ASSOCIATION by the House of

Delegates from among a slate of delegates nominated by the

House of Delegates Committee on Nominations and as otherwise

may be provided for in rules or procedures adopted by the House 288 of Delegates. Speaker-elect elections will be held every other year. The Speaker-elect shall serve until the end of the next 290 291 Annual Meeting of the ASSOCIATION following election at which 292 time the Speaker-elect shall be installed in the Office of Speaker. The Speaker shall serve for two years. The Speaker shall serve 293 294 until a successor is duly elected and/or installed. The Executive 295

Vice President of the ASSOCIATION shall serve as Secretary of the 296 House of Delegates. 297 Section 7. Meetings. The House of Delegates shall hold a regular 298 meeting during the Annual Meeting of this ASSOCIATION, this 299 regular meeting to consist of such sessions and to have an order of business as adopted by the House of Delegates. The House may, at the discretion of the Speaker, convene using electronic 301 302 means prior to the regular meeting outlined herein provided that 303 the Secretary of the House notifies the delegates at least 30 days

304 prior to convening such session. All House of Delegates Rules of Procedure and these Bylaws apply to all House sessions, whether 306 held electronically or in person. The House of Delegates may 307 hold special meetings at the call of the Speaker with the approval of the Board of Trustees, or upon written or electronic petition of a majority of authorized delegates provided that the Secretary of

the House notifies the delegates at least 10 days prior to convening such session. Special meetings of the House of 311

312 Delegates may occur electronically or be scheduled in person at 313 a time and location to be established by the Speaker with the

approval of the Board of Trustees. 314

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Section 8. Quorum. A majority of the delegates registered at any 315 regular or special meeting of the House of Delegates shall 317 constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.

318 Section 9. Committees. The House of Delegates shall have 319 committees as established by the Speaker and the Board of

320 Trustees. Such Committees shall be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates. The House of Delegates shall have the

322 following standing committees:

A. Committee on Nominations 323

324 B. Canvassers Committee

325 C. Policy Committees.

326 Committees shall have such number of members as the Board of 327 Trustees may establish and shall consider subjects only on

328 agendas approved by the Board of Trustees. The House of

Delegates Committee on Nominations shall nominate candidates 329

for Speaker of the House of Delegates in accordance with such 330

Bylaws, rules, or procedures as the House of Delegates deems

necessary or desirable to facilitate its business. The House of

333 Delegates Canvassers Committee shall certify the results of the

House of Delegates elections.

ARTICLE VII. RECOGNIZED AND AFFILIATED ORGANIZATIONS

335 **Section I. Recognized National Organizations.** Any national 336 organization representing pharmacy, the purposes of which are 337 consistent with the purposes of this ASSOCIATION, may be 338 designated a Recognized National Organization by the Board of 339 Trustees. The status of such an organization as a Recognized 340 National Organization may be terminated by the Board of 341 Trustees.

Section 2. Affiliated State Organizations. An organization,
 representing pharmacy, from a State, Territory, or the District of
 Columbia may be designated as an Affiliated State Organization
 by the Board of Trustees at its discretion.

ARTICLE VIII. ORGANIZATION OF MEMBERS

Section I. Organization. The Association shall have a membership 346 347 organization group representing at least the following segments 348 of members: pharmacy practitioners, student pharmacists, and 349 pharmaceutical scientists. Each group shall have an Executive Committee consisting of a President, a President-elect, and such 350 351 additional members as the Board of Trustees may establish 352 from time to time. Each Executive Committee shall be elected by 353 the members of the group pursuant to procedures established by 354 the Board of Trustees.

Section 2. Additional membership organization groups. The Board may, from time to time, establish additional membership organization groups reflecting the diverse professional needs of the membership.

359 Section 3. Programming. Each membership organization group 360 shall conduct such programs as may be established from time to 361 time for the benefit of its members, the profession, or the public. 362 Programs are subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees. 363 The student pharmacist organization group may recognize an 364 affiliated student pharmacist chapter at any ACPE-accredited or 365 American Association of Colleges of Pharmacy recognized school 366 or college of pharmacy.

ARTICLE IX. MEETINGS

Section 1. Annual Meeting. This ASSOCIATION shall hold an
Annual Meeting each calendar year at a time and place
established by the Board of Trustees. The Annual Meeting shall
consist of such sessions and shall have an order of business
as specified in the official program for the Annual Meeting.
Section 2. Special Meetings. The ASSOCIATION may hold special

Board of Trustees. The time and place of special meetings shall be established by the President. The order of business for a special meeting shall be as specified in the call parties or agenda.

meetings at the call of the President with the approval of the

376 special meeting shall be as specified in the call, notice or agenda

377 of the special meeting.

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ARTICLE X. ELECTIONS

Section 1. Nominations. Candidates for election as ASSOCIATION
 President-elect and Elected Trustees shall be from among
 pharmacists in the Member category. A slate of two (2)

381 candidates shall be nominated for each Elected Trustee slot and382 President-Elect.

Section 2. Nominating Committee. The Committee on 383 Nominations shall nominate all candidates for President-elect and Elected Trustees as provided for in this Article. The 386 Committee on Nominations shall consist of the most recent 387 nonincumbent Former President, the immediate former Speaker 388 of the House of Delegates, and three (3) other members 389 appointed by the President. No individual shall serve on the 390 Committee on Nominations in more than three (3) consecutive 391 calendar years.

Section 3. Election Procedure. Except as may otherwise be
 provided in these Bylaws, the names of candidates for election
 and a mail ballot shall be provided all members entitled to vote.
 Executed ballots must be received by the date published on the

The Committee of Canvassers shall certify the results of all

ASSOCIATION elections, except for elections in the House of

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399 Delegates. The Committee of Canvassers shall meet following a 400 tally of timely, valid ballots and shall review the election 401 procedure for compliance with these Bylaws. It shall certify to the 402 Board of Trustees the results of the election for each position. 403 The names of candidates elected shall be made public following 404 certification of the election by the Committee of Canvassers. 405 Once certified, the results of any election shall not be subject to 406 challenge.

Section 4. Time of Election. Except as may otherwise be provided
in these Bylaws, the ASSOCIATION nomination and election
process shall be conducted pursuant to a schedule established by
the Executive Vice President with the approval of the Board of
Trustees, which will permit candidates elected to assume office
as provided in these Bylaws.

Section 5. Installation. Except as may otherwise be provided in
these Bylaws, Officers and Elected Trustees of the ASSOCIATION
and the elected officers of the membership organization groups
shall assume office at the conclusion of business on the last day
of the Annual Meeting of the ASSOCIATION following the year in
which they are elected.

Trustees, an Honorary President of the ASSOCIATION shall be elected pursuant to the election procedures established in these Bylaws. The Honorary President shall be a member of the ASSOCIATION, shall have made significant contributions to the ASSOCIATION, and shall serve for a one-year term commencing on the first day of the Annual Meeting following the year in which elected.

ARTICLE XI. FINANCES

427 **Section 1. Financial and Investment Policy.** The financial and 428 investment policy of this ASSOCIATION shall be as established 429 from time to time by the Board of Trustees with the advice of the 430 Treasurer, Executive Vice President, and such other financial 431 advisors as the Board of Trustees may deem necessary or 432 desirable. Investments shall not be restricted to those approved 433 by law by the District of Columbia or any other jurisdiction.

434 **Section 2. Financial Administration.** The Executive Vice 435 President, with the approval of the Treasurer, shall be 436 responsible for the continuing management of the financial 437 affairs of this ASSOCIATION. The Board of Trustees shall approve

38 any bank intended to serve as a repository of ASSOCIATION

439 assets and a public accounting firm that shall be retained to conduct an annual audit of ASSOCIATION accounts. All 440 disbursements of ASSOCIATION funds shall be pursuant to such 441 442 policies and procedures as may be established from time to time by the Board of Trustees and are to be monitored and 443 444 reviewed on a regular basis by the Treasurer and the Executive Vice President or by the Executive Vice President alone.

445 446 Section 3. Bonds. The Treasurer, the Executive Vice President, 447 and such other members, employees, or agents of this 448 ASSOCIATION as the Board of Trustees may direct shall be 449 bonded for proper care and disposition of ASSOCIATION property 450 in their possession or custody. Such bonds shall be in amounts and subject to such conditions as the Board of Trustees shall 451 direct. The expense of such bonds shall be borne by the 452 453 ASSOCIATION. Section 4. Section 1. Purposes. The Board of Pharmacy Specialties shall 457 458 exist for the following purposes:

- A. To grant recognition of appropriate pharmacy practice 459 specialties based on criteria established by the Board of 460 461 Pharmacy Specialties.
- B. To establish standards for certification and recertification 462 463 in recognized pharmacy practice specialties.
- 464 C. To grant qualified pharmacists certification and recertification 465 in recognized pharmacy practice specialties.
- D. To serve as a coordinating agency and informational 467 clearinghouse for organizations and pharmacists in recognized 468 pharmacy practice specialties.
- 469 Section 2. Bylaws and Composition. The Board of Pharmacy Specialties shall operate under Bylaws (and subsequent 470 471 amendments) approved by the ASSOCIATION's Board of 472 Trustees. The composition of the Board of Pharmacy Specialties shall be outlined in the approved Bylaws. 473
- Section 3. Finances. The ASSOCIATION shall act as fiscal agent for 475 the Board of Pharmacy Specialties in accordance with procedures established by the ASSOCIATION's Board of Trustees. The 476
- 477 ASSOCIATION shall prepare an annual audited financial report of
- 478 Board of Pharmacy Specialties activities.

ARTICLE XIII. PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY AND **PRECEDENCE**

479 Section 1. Parliamentary Authority. The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order shall govern this 480 ASSOCIATION in all cases to which they are applicable. The 482 Executive Vice President may retain the services of a qualified parliamentarian for any meeting when such services are deemed 483 necessary or desirable and shall do so for all deliberative 484 meetings of the House of Delegates.

Section 2. Precedence. In any case of conflict between these Bylaws and any other bylaws, parliamentary authority, or rules or 488 procedures of any membership organization group, these Bylaws shall prevail. All such apparent conflicts shall be resolved by the Board of Trustees whose decision shall be binding on all 490 491 interested parties.

Section 1. Bylaws. Every proposed amendment of these Bylaws,

following the approval of counsel and the Board of Trustees, shall 494 be submitted with a mail ballot to all members entitled to vote. 495 Executed ballots must be received by this ASSOCIATION by the 496 date published on the ballot. A proposed amendment of these 497 Bylaws shall become effective upon receiving a two-thirds (2/3) 498 affirmative vote certified by the Committee of Canvassers to the 499 Board of Trustees. Once certified, the results of any vote on a proposed Bylaw amendment shall not be subject to challenge. 501 Section 2. Code of Ethics. Every proposed amendment of the Code of Ethics, with the approval of counsel and the Board of Trustees, shall be submitted with a mail ballot to all members entitled to vote. Executed ballots must be received by this 504 505 ASSOCIATION by the date published on the ballot. A proposed 506 amendment of the Code of Ethics shall become effective upon receiving a two-thirds (2/3) affirmative vote certified by the 507 Committee of Canvassers to the Board of Trustees.

ARTICLE XV. NOTICE

509 Section 1. Previous Notice. Any previous notice required to be provided any member of this ASSOCIATION may be given by printing the notice in a publication regularly provided the member entitled to notice or by mailing the notice to each member entitled to notice at the member's mailing address then indicated in the membership records of this ASSOCIATION.
